Integrating expertise from U-M's leading programs in medicine, law, public health, engineering, nursing, public policy, business, information and social work, IHPI research groups focus on issues ranging from kidney and heart disease to surgical and nursing care, and from children's health and mental health to cost, quality and access issues.
